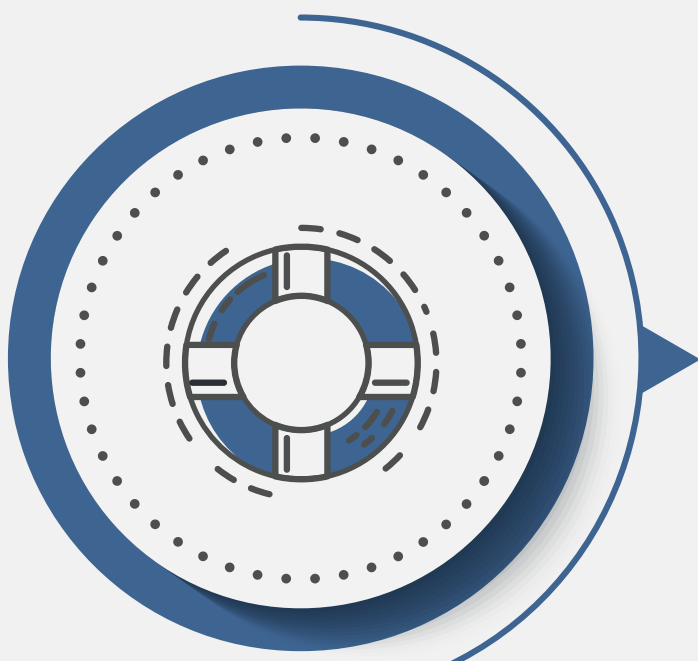


A GUIDE TO BEST CRUISE FROM VANCOUVER TO ALASKA
